### How Basa's babies are getting the best start in life

"In our community, women used to give birth at home. Sometimes the babies died," says Rokia, a local mum. For cultural reasons, many women didn't want to have midwives present, so there was often a risk of life-threatening complications.

Thanks to you, Rokia joined a support group for mums-to-be where they chat about their challenges and experiences. They learn how giving birth in hospital with midwife support contributes to safer births for mums and their babies.

Rokia found the group so helpful that she now volunteers and helps teach other mums. Thanks to you, mums-to-be in Basa have a support group they trust, most women now give birth in a health centre, and very few mums and babies die during childbirth.

# We've come a long way, and we're still making progress — *all thanks to you*.


We've been working with the community of Basa since **2004**. Back then, children faced many problems: malnutrition or stunted growth due to a lack of nutritious food; limited prospects due to poor education; and little or no access to healthcare.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. Signs of malnutrition are picked up quicker now, so children have a better chance of returning to full health; schools are more welcoming places, with more trained teachers and new classrooms; and expectant mothers are learning how to give their children a healthier start in life by going to regular check-ups and getting them vaccinated.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another five to six years. We plan to leave in **2021**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.

**Just to say:** Most families struggle with reading and writing, and with only dirt tracks for volunteers to travel on, replies to letters and cards can take a long time. Thanks for bearing with us.

### How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- \* 20 midwives are fully trained to deliver even more babies safely.
- \* 630 school children have new workbooks, pens and paper so they can learn with their friends.
- \* 1,685 children have improved their reading now that teachers are better trained in teaching reading and maths.
- Expectant mums can go to a clinic nearby, and get advice from a skilled health worker, rather than walking 10km.

- \* The families in 10 villages have clean drinking water from 20 new wells built a short walk from their homes.
- \* Families in 127 households now have toilets and live in a healthy and clean environment with less risk of disease.
- \* 11,272 children received medicine to protect them from malaria – a life-threatening disease.
- \* More families have learned how to grow nutritious food.

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them


know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
