A new future for children like Tanu

Tanu, 8, belongs to a low-caste group in Indian society. The children are least likely to attend school, owing to discrimination. Tanu and her friends were bullied by other children because they were unclean. She ran away from her local children's club the few times that she went because of how the other children treated her. Because the community excluded children like her, Tanu couldn't go to school.

Thanks to you, Meenu, II, learned about life skills at her children's club. Meenu and her friends then got involved in the health and hygiene campaign with Tanu's community, and taught them about hygiene. After six months, Tanu's community began to manage the cleanliness of their homes and village.

The ripple effect of those life skills sessions means local children now stand up for themselves and support other children's development. Thanks to you and to the efforts of children like Meenu, Tanu's life has changed dramatically.

"While visiting the lower caste children, I felt some were ready to join primary school," says Meenu. Now Tanu and I3 other children from her community go to school.

"I am very happy to be part of this centre, now I am able to read, write and do simple maths. I have also learned how to keep clean," says Tanu.






We've come a long way, and we're still making progress — *all thanks to you*.

We've been working with the community of Bhojpur since **2005**. Back then, children faced many problems: poor education; poor knowledge about personal hygiene; malnutrition; and vulnerability to abuse.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. The community wants to change the situation of inequality; parents have learned business skills, helping them provide for their children; families have received farming advice to help grow more food; there is better access to primary school education for children; and nutritious foods help children recover from malnutrition.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another four to five years. We plan to leave in **2020**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.

How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- * Attitudes have changed and the community now sees how education gives their children opportunities.
- * 95% of the most vulnerable families now give their children milk to drink, keeping them strong and healthy.
- * The community works together to fix the problem of teachers coming late to school.
- * 40 boys and girls have passed a course that prepares them to apply for banking jobs.
- * 15 families have enrolled their daughters in skills training this year.

- Children are bullied less and are gaining confidence now families understand good hygiene.
- * Families use income from selling buffalo milk to buy healthy food and send their children to school.
- More children enjoy school and can say, like Anjali, "School is like a temple for me".
- Life skills classes in leadership and teamwork have given 600 young people confidence to make better life choices.

Mary has been a sponsor for 34 years. In this time she's sponsored eight children. She tells us what this was like for her...

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them

know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
