Growing hope for children's futures in Chioco

Agnes, 22, Constancia, 20, and Mario, 14, live with their parents in a village in Chioco. When the children were younger, the family couldn't earn enough from farming to provide everything they needed. Agnes helped on the farm rather than go to college. Constancia and Mario went to school without school uniform and essential equipment.

Agnes and her parents spent a lot of time digging wells to water their crops, and that reduced how much they could grow. They grew barely enough to feed them all, leaving very little to sell. Thanks to you, water is pumped onto their farm so they can grow more rather than dig wells.

"Now we produce more vegetables throughout the year, we can all eat properly. The extra food we have, we sell at our local market," says Constancia.

"My parents were able to buy me and my younger brother school uniforms and equipment, and Agnes was finally able to go into further education," she says, smiling.

The future looks bright for this family, all thanks to sponsors like you.


We've come a long way, and we're still making progress

all thanks to you.

We've been working with the community of Chioco since **2003**. Back then, children faced many problems: fear of being orphaned through AIDS; malnutrition; lack of education; low standards of teaching; poor access to healthcare; and fear of catching a preventable illness.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. Schools have new classrooms; parents now understand the importance of sending their children to school; and families have learned to grow more varied crops to feed their children. But there have been setbacks as the drought over the last two years has been made worse by El Niño, making it harder to grow food. Without your support, it could have been a lot worse. The training in new farming techniques mean families are better able to cope, but the situation is still a concern. That's why we need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another two to three years. We plan to leave in **2018**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them


know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
