Joan* escaped early marriage to continue her education

Joan* is 13 years old. During a holiday at her grandmother's, she was introduced to a man much older than her and then forcibly taken to his house and kept a prisoner for three days.

In the end, Joan managed to escape, running barefoot from the house in the middle of the night. "I spent the night in a tree: I felt this was safer than being caught trying to leave," Joan says.

She made her way back home to her aunt's house the next day, arriving exhausted and frightened. Through sponsors' help, Joan had been taught about child rights in the community and understood that what was happening to her was a violation of her rights.

Thanks to you, Joan received psychological support and counselling from the World Vision child protection team. She soon started to feel safe again under her aunt's protection. Now she is in school and studying hard to realise her dream of becoming a teacher. "I really would not like to see this happening to any other children again. I advise fellow children to be courageous, just like I was," Joan says.

"I thank God for rescuing me from early marriage because otherwise I may not have been able to proceed with my studies," says Joan.






We've come a long way, and we're still making progress — all thanks to you.

We've been working with the community of Kilimatinde since 2003. Back then, children faced many problems: lack of clean water, lack of basic sanitation; fear of illness; and hunger and malnutrition.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. More children are recovering from malnutrition and growing up healthy and strong; thousands more mothers know how to feed their children healthier diets; children have received vitamin supplements to further safeguard their health; and better water storage is helping families to drink safe, clean water.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another six to seven years. We plan to leave in **2022**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.



How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- * We've given 4,653 young children important vaccinations, helping to protect them from life-threatening diseases.
- * 5,700 children are sleeping more safely at night under a mosquito net, helping to protect them from malaria.
- * We've trained 146 adults to grow nutritious crops, like rice and vegetables, and sunflowers for oil.
- * We're supporting more mothers before and after birth. 1,980 have attended clinics to help keep themselves and their unborn babies safe.

- * We're improving hygiene for 6,800 people by making sure they have better toilets, drying racks for dishes, and pits for household waste.
- * 14 savings and loans groups are helping more families to be independent and to start their own businesses. 501 people benefited from a loan.
- * 143 more children now have a birth certificate. This allows them to have better healthcare and have the best start in life.
- * 75 adults have been trained to grow drought-resistant crops to help feed their families.

Mary has been a sponsor for 34 years. In this time she's sponsored eight children. She tells us what this was like for her...

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them

know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."


