### Turning life around for Hosea and his family

Hosea, 13, lives with his grandmother, uncle and younger sister and brother. After his grandfather died, his grandmother struggled to provide for them all. She and Hosea's uncle could only find casual farm work. There was just enough money for one meal a day and nothing left over for Hosea's schooling.

Hosea had to drop out of school. His future seemed hopeless. He worked all day, watching over his neighbour's cattle whilst they were grazing, collecting beans from nearby farms and carrying bricks for money. He didn't even have time to play football.

Thanks to you, there is hope for Hosea. A local savings group offered his grandmother a loan to buy land, fertiliser and seeds. She grew enough to feed Hosea and his family, with more to sell at the market.

"I feel cared for and protected. I have stopped work and enjoy school. I am sure my dream of becoming a maths teacher will be possible," Hosea says.

## We've come a long way, and we're still making progress –


## all thanks to you.

We've been working in the community of Kisiriri since **2004.** Back then children faced many problems: the grief of being orphaned through AIDS; fear of abuse; the threat of starvation or severe malnutrition; poor-quality education; and the risk of malaria, diarrhoea and worm infestation.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. Many malnourished children have been helped to recover so they can grow up healthy and strong; children are doing better in school, so they can make the most of future opportunities; and child protection groups have been set up to help teach the whole community about children's rights.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another four to five years. We plan to leave in **2020**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.



### How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- We've given families the skills to earn from livelihoods such as weaving and beekeeping, with help from 45 community groups.
- Families have clean drinking water a short walk from their homes from 3 new boreholes and 1 community well.
- 44 farmers are learning to grow better crops and trade them to feed their families.
- Vulnerable children are protected and know the 17 community groups offer a safe place to go.

- Children in 4 children's clubs help to keep their school clean and protect the environment by planting trees.
- \* 1,505 more children sleep under mosquito nets, safe from life-threatening malaria.
- 2,193 children under five years old have been immunised, protecting them from preventable diseases.
- I,596 children eat more nutritious food now their families know how to grow crops and start up small businesses.

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them


know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
