Vanesa, 12, and her friends now influence their own learning

Vanesa, 12, lives in Lezha with her father, mother and elder sister. Outside of school, there was nowhere for Vanesa and her friends to play safely, or things for them to do to focus their energy. Thanks to your support, student councils are helping older children like Vanesa and her friends have a say in how things are run in their school. And thanks to you, student councils have been set up in eight schools across Lezha.

Schools are being strengthened by allowing children to join in on the decision-making and share ideas about their learning with their teachers. Vanesa and her friends have been involved in activities that are helping children to be more accepting of their peers, especially those children who have disabilities.

"Through our discussions in class I see that boys in our school have changed their attitude. They used to be disrespectful towards children who are poor or excluded, but by observing our behaviour they have started to be more friendly towards these children and even have been playing with them," says Vanesa.

Thanks to you, children like Vanesa and her friends can be role models to other children, and are actively taking part in their learning, which allows them to develop and create purpose in their lives.

"We are more aware, informed and mature now and we will work harder to make our school a better place for us all," says Daniela,13.






We've come a long way, and we're still making progress — *all thanks to you*.

We've been working with the community of Lezha since **2003**. Back then, children faced many problems: fear of abuse; poor-quality education; social and emotional isolation; poverty; early marriage; and no safe places to play.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. Children are better protected from abuse; parents understand how education can improve their children's lives and encourage their learning; and children are helped with their homework so are more likely to reach their full potential.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another seven to eight years. We plan to leave in **2023**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.

How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- * 2 child protection units are bringing a support network of people together to identify and respond to the needs of the most vulnerable children to help keep them safe.
- * We're helping to protect more children from danger. 700 school children have learned what to do in an emergency.
- * 22 children from vulnerable families were given food parcels, so they could eat a nutritious meal and take medicines to make them feel well.
- Summer camps are bringing 600 children together to learn life skills and play through sports, competitions and games.

- * We've run 16 sessions to teach children about their rights and how to keep themselves and their friends safe.
- We've taught 400 school children about better hygiene habits, like keeping clean, brushing their teeth, washing their hands, and also how to stay healthy.
- * We're helping children to care for their environment and look after their schools. 30 trees were planted recently by school children.
- * We've trained 45 parents about their children's rights and how to keep them safe from harm.

know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."


