
Growing a happier, healthier future for Delia

Delia, II, lives in a remote village in the hills of Mosoj P'unchay with her mum, brother and sister. "Before, we did not eat many vegetables," says Delia's mum, Teodocia. The ground is steep and therefore hard for many families to grow enough food to feed their children. They used to just eat potatoes because they couldn't afford to buy other vegetables and the market was far away.


Thanks to you, Delia is no longer scared of going to bed with an empty tummy, because her mum was taught how to build a greenhouse to grow vegetables. "I grow cucumber, spinach, chard and tomatoes," Teodocia says. Now, she can give her three children nutritious meals and not worry about them getting ill. "My children like these vegetables very much," she says.

Delia and her family can enjoy fresh vegetables, giving them the nutrition they need. Any food left over is sold, and the extra money is used to buy clothes and repair their home.

"I am thankful my children can have healthy vegetables and hope for their futures," says Teodocia.






We've come a long way, and we're still making progress – all thanks to you.

We've been working with the community of Mosoj P'unchay since **2004**. Back then, children faced many problems: not having enough to eat; poor-quality education; fear of violence; and the threat of disease.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. Using improved farming methods, families have been able to grow more crops; mothers are more aware of the importance of feeding their children a balanced diet; and there is better access to healthcare before, during and after pregnancy for mothers.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another seven to eight years. We plan to leave in **2023**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.

How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- * Children have been given books, uniforms and pens so they can go to school and enjoy learning.
- * Families have learned how to grow nutritious food, giving their children healthy meals so they don't go to school on an empty stomach.
- * 56 teachers have had extra training, giving children the best possible education and hope for a better future.
- * Local health centres have been set up to support parents with sick children, helping them get the care they need closer to home.

- * Over 100 mums have attended antenatal classes and learned the importance of breastfeeding and getting their babies vaccinated against diseases.
- * Families have been given greenhouses and training in how to grow crops.

 They can now enjoy eating fresh vegetables with their meals.
- Youth workshops are helping prepare older children to get jobs and learn essential skills for a brighter future.
- Children have been taught about their rights and how to get help if they feel they need extra support.

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them


know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
