Better toilets mean more girls like Flevian are enrolling at school

Flevian is 12 years old and lives at home with her parents Kenneth and Rose in Nyatike. There were no toilets in Flevian's school. The only option was to go behind the bushes nearby. Pupils needed to ask for permission from the teacher to be excused from class to go to the toilet. However, having to use the bushes is scary and unpleasant, as there are flies and even poisonous snakes. Flevian sometimes felt too frightened to go. During

rainy season floods, human waste would be washed into the water sources for the village, causing diseases like diarrhoea, which their parents could not afford to treat with expensive medicines.

Thanks to your support, we've built toilets in schools for children like Flevian. They are now free from the fear of having to go to the toilet and falling ill. The toilets mean more children have enrolled at school, especially girls. Since the building of toilets in the primary school, enrolment has increased by a fifth. There are also more teachers wanting to teach at the school.

"Because we have toilets, we are free from diseases. So now, we are so happy because we don't expect snakes to threaten our lives, and even flies can't disturb us," says a happy Flevian.






We've come a long way, and we're still making progress — *all thanks to you*.

We've been working with the community of Nyatike since 1994. Back then, children faced many problems: the fear of illness due to a lack of immunisations and poor sanitation; too few schools and teachers, meaning the children weren't getting a decent education; low incomes; and insufficient food, so many children went to bed hungry.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. More young children have been immunised so they are healthier and less frightened about catching diseases; and more children are eating nutritious food, growing up healthy and strong and developing as they should, with the energy to enjoy their childhoods to the full.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another four to five years. We plan to leave in **2020** but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.



How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- * 2,620 more children now have a birth certificate, allowing them to have better healthcare and the best start in life.
- * 12,000 trees were planted by students across 41 schools to help the environment and make their schools a nicer place to learn.
- * We've helped build 10 maternity rooms in health centres, so that mothers can have a safe place to give birth.
- * 250 households and 747 school children now have access to clean water only a short distance from their homes.

- * We've built 181 toilets in households where there were none. Families can now live with less risk of catching diseases.
- * We've set up 12 mothers' groups which are helping to keep expectant mothers and their children healthy.
- 2 community groups are teaching families about better hygiene habits such as hand washing, to help protect them from disease.
- * We're helping more mothers deliver their babies safely through better healthcare. This year, 1,801 babies have been delivered safely.

know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."


