Bringing hope to children like Puja

Puja, 7, lives in a village in Panchbibi with her mum, dad and brothers. Poor and vulnerable children like Puja used to go to the toilet in a nearby field. Few knew about personal hygiene. Many villagers didn't wash their hands after going to the toilet or before meals, and often didn't wear shoes. So children suffered from preventable illnesses like diarrhoea.

Then Puja's mum joined a new community group. After learning about health and hygiene, members toured the village to make the case for building proper toilets in homes. Many families were convinced. Puja's parents couldn't afford to install a toilet, so the group paid.

Thanks to you, Puja and her friends also learned about hygiene. Inspired, they marched through their village with flags, promoting good habits and trying to stop people going to the toilet outside.

"We accepted the challenge to have correct hygiene practice and strive to continue having 100% sanitation in our village," says Sujan, group chairman. Better yet, fewer children now get ill from waterborne diseases.

"I used to go to the toilet outside in the open, without sandals on. Now I wear shoes when I go to the toilet," says Puja, 7.






We've come a long way, and we're still making progress – *all thanks to you*.

We've been working with the community of Panchbibi since **2003**. Back then, children faced many problems: not enough food; poor health due to preventable illness; lack of education and essential life skills; and social and emotional isolation.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. Children understand how washing their hands after using the toilet reduces the risk of diarrhoea; mums know how to prepare nutritious foods so their children are healthier; more children go to school; and now that most parents are literate, they can start their own businesses.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another three to four years. We plan to leave in **2019**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.



How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- Children get treatment quicker now their parents recognise the symptoms of common ailments.
- 90% of children completed primary school thanks to teacher training and support from parents.
- More girls go to school since their parents learned about the harm caused by child marriage.
- Most families eat three meals a day thanks to new ways of farming that boost their harvest.

- * Mums use new sewing skills to earn extra money and provide better for their children.
- * 20% more children say they feel protected from abuse and neglect thanks to community awareness sessions.
- 300 children understand their rights and are now ambassadors within their community.
- * 240 newly-trained leaders run children's clubs where children run, play and learn.

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them


know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
