### Taking the most vulnerable under their wing

Mortuo Mothers' Group has been running for many years. Members support one another to gain life skills, and become the voice of their community.

When Ebola struck, families were torn apart. Christiana, the group's leader, saw an opportunity to help not hide. Thanks to your support, the group grew stronger than ever. They took in abandoned children, embracing orphans as their own. Mums pooled their savings to buy seeds and cassava-grinding machines, helping to rebuild lives and livelihoods.

The group planted a new harvest, reaped, and sold enough food to look after all their families, even those who had taken in children. The group cares for over 30 children from their own and neighbouring villages. "From the savings, we pay their school fees, books, uniforms and drinking water for school," says Christiana.

Just as Ebola doesn't have boundaries in its devastation, these women don't see barriers in protecting the most vulnerable children. Kargbo, another group member says, "If we don't help these children, who else will? We care for them, and that's the reason we do it."

# We've come a long way, and we're still making progress — *all thanks to you*.


We've been working with the community of Tegloma since **2006**. Back then, children faced many problems: fear of abuse; malnutrition; and poor-quality education.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. There have been improvements in teacher training; mothers' clubs have been set up which monitor and protect children from all forms of abuse; and pregnant women are encouraged to deliver their babies with trained staff at a community health unit.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for children like your sponsored child, particularly as families continue to rebuild their lives after Ebola, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another five to six years. We plan to leave in 2021, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made. and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.

**Just to say:** As you might imagine after the Ebola outbreak, we're a little behind with delivering letters. Thanks for bearing with us.



### How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- More girls and boys have the opportunity to study for a brighter future now II new teachers have been trained.
- New mothers' clubs care for children affected by Ebola, giving them meals, uniforms and books.
- \* Families get soap bars and learn how to stay healthy and well at new hand-washing sessions.
- \* Girls no longer fear having to get married before they are 18, thanks to new rules the community campaigned for.

- \* More children are registered at birth, meaning they can be immunised and enrol in school.
- Children who have been orphaned by Ebola are cared for by adoptive families.
- \* 11,822 children now enjoy free healthcare since community groups lobbied the government.
- New mothers' groups help mums to save money and set up their own businesses to provide for their families.

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them


know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
