### Stitching a brighter future together for Ramatou

Ramatou, 22, left school not knowing what her future held. Then, one day, while listening to the radio, she heard about a learning centre offering a sewing course. She went to every lesson and quickly picked up the skills she needed to sew beautifully.

"I was always the first to master what we were shown," she says. At the end of the course the best students got a sewing machine. "Today, thanks to this machine, I can meet all my needs."

Ramatou can now provide for her family by making clothes and selling them at the local market. She also makes her husband's clothes and repairs his suitcase when he rips it.

Your incredible generosity has meant Ramatou no longer fears not being able to provide for her family. Instead, she gives the extra money she makes to help her mother. She's teaching her neighbours how to sew, too. She dreams of opening her own sewing workshop where other women can learn how to sew and start up their own business, just like she has.

## We've come a long way, and we're still making progress – *all thanks to you*.


We've been working with the community of Tera since **1998.** Back then, children faced many problems, from malnutrition to social and emotional isolation, in particular children with disabilities.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. There is better access to preschool and primary school education; health centres have been set up, so families can get medical help more easily; and nutritious food helps children recover from malnutrition so they can run, play and enjoy being a child.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another four to five years. We plan to leave in **2020**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.

**Just to say:** Our colleagues in Niger have been reviewing how they send replies to cards and letters. DHL were the cheapest and most reliable, so that's why post will be delivered by them from now on.



### How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- \* Savings groups and training workshops are now supporting women to start their own businesses.
- Over 1,400 children have had a fantastic improvement in their reading, writing and maths because teachers are better trained.
- Local community groups now regularly meet to learn how to look after the most vulnerable in their community.
- \* 20 volunteers have been trained and now visit families to make sure their children are growing up healthy and strong.

- \* Sewing lessons are helping women learn a new skill and start their own businesses.
- \* Over 1,000 more children have birth certificates, so they can enrol in school and sit their exams.
- \* Farmers learned how to grow more and different varieties of crops so they can feed their families nutritious meals.
- \* Community groups have been trained to recognise and cope with drought, making families better able to cope with changes in climate.

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them


know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
