Bringing hope to children like Vung

Vung, 12, lives in a small village on the mountainous hillside of Tiddim with her mum, brother and sister. For children like Vung, life has been hard. During the winter it was tough for her widowed mum to grow enough food for them to eat, let alone sell.

Earning enough to send Vung and her brother and sister to school was all but impossible. Her mum worried that in winter her children would get wet and cold under their home's broken roof.

Thanks to you, the local community group gave Vung's mother, Nu Cing, a milking goat. She sold its milk so her children could go to school. After a storm destroyed their roof, the family was able to sell the goat at this time of need to buy a better zinc roof.

Through their links with the community group, Vung's family have since been given a pigsty and piglets. They use the money they make from their livestock for education and health check-ups. Now Vung looks forward to a happy future.

"I love sleeping under a safe roof, and it keeps us warm. All I can say is thanks to God and to World Vision sponsors," says Vung.






We've come a long way, and we're still making progress – *all thanks to you*.

We've been working with the community of Tiddim since **2005**. Back then, children faced many problems: malnutrition; lack of sanitation and poor hygiene; poor-quality education; and the risk of catching a preventable disease coupled with poor healthcare.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. Amongst other things, children are less hungry now that their families know how to grow more crops; pregnant women are better cared for and more babies are born with a midwife present, increasing their chances of growing up healthy and strong; and schools now have better resources, helping more children reach their full potential.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost.

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another seven to eight years. We plan to leave in **2023**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.



How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- I,200 children now know about their rights and how to protect themselves and their friends.
- 28 vulnerable children are better off now their families have piglets to breed and sell.
- 7 villages have a referral system so more children under five years old get health check-ups.
- More children are learning now there are 12 schools with new classrooms, 10 new secondary schools and 15 new study centres.

- \$ 50 childcare centres help stop children getting ill by offering new hand-washing facilities.
- I,072 children are healthier now their mums know how to cook nutritious meals.
- * 420 farmers learned how to prevent disease in their animals, and earn more for their families.
- I,429 people learned how to make a mud stove and use less firewood when they cook family meals.



"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them


know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
