The future is bright for Bipin

Bipin is 12 and lives in a village in Vaishali with his mum, dad, three sisters and two brothers. Life has been hard for Bipin. His parents couldn't earn enough money to provide the essentials for their children. Half of the crops that Bipin's dad grew had to be given to the owner of the field that they rented.

Thanks to you, a village development committee was set up, and through this, Bipin's family were given a cow. Bipin's mum and dad made a deal to supply a local hotel with milk from their cow, and in return were given an advance that they could use to pay off their loan.

Today, Bipin is able to go to school and is getting a decent education. His mum and dad have been able to rent more land, which means more space to grow food to harvest and earn more money.


We've come a long way, and we're still making progress — *all thanks to you*.

We've been working with the community of Vaishali since **2005**. Back then, children faced many problems: malnutrition; fear of illness; poor hygiene; and a lack of education.

Since then, things have begun to change for the better. Children are recovering from malnutrition, giving them the strength to run, play and enjoy their childhoods; more babies are being breastfed and immunised, keeping them healthy, disease-free and giving them the best possible start in life; and more children are going to school and getting the education they need to reach their potential.

Despite these improvements, life is still hard for your sponsored child, and we really need your continuing support to ensure all the good we have managed to achieve for them isn't lost

Thanks to your incredibly generous sponsorship of your sponsored child, we can stay in the area for another six to seven years. We plan to leave in **2022**, but we will only go once we are confident that the change you have made, and the hope that you have given, will continue after we have left.



How you have helped this year...

We've picked out a small selection of the ways you have helped to bring hope to your sponsored child and their community. The reality is that you've helped us achieve much, much more.

- * 4,500 children now have access to clean and safe drinking water, meaning they no longer have to fear quenching their thirst.
- We've given cattle to the most vulnerable families in the community. They can now sell their milk to make money to provide for their children.
- * 100 volunteers have learned about child rights, meaning that children are safer and better protected.
- * More parents now have a regular income and can give their children the best start in life.

- * 88% of children are now attending children's groups, helping them grow in confidence and enjoy their childhoods to the full.
- * More mothers are now feeding their children a more nutritious diet with green vegetables and lentils rather than just potato and rice.
- * 82% of children had essential vaccinations before their first birthday.
- * We've given benches and desks to schools, making children more comfortable and happier while they're learning.

"As I never married and haven't had children of my own it's been a blessing knowing that I have helped in some way to improve the lives of children a long way away and let them


know that I care about them and love them. I will always be a sponsor and support World Vision even when I'm gone."
